



Summer Fusion Camp FAQs

How do I know which age group to register my child for?

Please register your child for the grade they will be entering in Fall 2025.

How many children are in each camp age group?

Each age group has a maximum of 24 campers.

Can I sign up my child for multiple weeks?

You may register each child for up to four weeks of camp.

Will my child have lunch and snack breaks?

All classes have a 30-minute lunch break as well as morning and afternoon snack breaks. We ask that you provide two snacks and a packed lunch.

Will my child play outside?

We will play outside on the grassy mall directly in front of Flandrau, at a small, shaded park plaza near Flandrau, or in the shade just east of Flandrau's entrance.

Will my child go on any field trips?

Some camp sessions may include on-campus, walking field trips. Field trip date and location will be communicated to parents and guardians ahead of time.

Who will be teaching my child?

Each group has an instructor, a camp counselor, and a junior camp counselor. Instructors are local teachers, camp counselors are undergraduate or graduate students, and junior camp counselors are high school volunteers. Fusion Camp staff undergo background screening and participate in pre-camp training that includes training in first aid, CPR, curriculum content, and classroom management strategies.

What is the process for dropping off and picking up my child each day?

Drop-off and pick-up for camp sessions will take place in the small parking lot directly north of the Flandrau Science Center & Planetarium (Cherry Avenue and Hawthorne Street). To ensure your child's safety, we ask that you park your vehicle and walk with them to check in each morning. Flandrau will only release campers to authorized persons at pick up. You may

authorize people in addition to parents/legal guardians who may pick up your child with the presentation of valid identification.

What happens if there are disciplinary issues at camp?

We keep campers thoroughly engaged and rarely experience serious behavioral issues. We will handle discipline issues on a case-by-case basis. Talking with campers is our first response; "think time" is utilized when necessary. We will relay all behavioral issues to parents as they occur and will work in partnership with families to develop effective solutions.

What happens if a child is injured at camp?

Each camper's Medical Release (completed during registration) authorizes certified camp staff members to administer first aid. In case of emergency, camp staff will obtain care at University of Arizona Medical Center and contact the child's parents.

My child is academically gifted. Can he or she attend a camp listed for older children?

Child development is a major consideration in creating our camp programs. Our camps are designed by a curriculum specialist to provide age-appropriate educational content and social interaction. We have also taken into consideration that many children who attend specialized camps come with great interest and knowledge in specific topics. Given our experiences and our emphasis on age and developmentally appropriate programs, we do not accept younger children into programs for older students.

My child takes daily medication. Can you help administer it?

Campers are not permitted to carry their own over the counter or prescription medications at Fusion Camp. The Medicine Administration Consent Form must be completed and allows you to provide detailed instructions for your child's medication. Medication that is taken on a regularly scheduled basis will be kept in Flandrau offices and administered by the camp coordinator. Any medication that is needed when an emergency arises, such as an EpiPen for an allergic reaction, will be kept with the camp staff so that it is always immediately available.

My child has a learning disability or other special needs. Will he or she be able to participate in the camp program?

We pride ourselves on meeting the needs of each child and are happy to talk with you about your camper's special needs. We prefer to know about all special circumstances before camp begins to assist with planning and staff training. If your child has medical or special needs, we'd like to talk with you prior to registering your child for camp to ensure that we can properly support them. What are the camp benefits for having a Flandrau Membership?

A Flandrau membership provides many benefits, including a 10% discount on Fusion Camp, birthday parties, and Flandrau Science Store purchases. It also includes free admission to exhibits and reduced admission to planetarium shows for up to two adults and four children. A 75% refund is available for cancellations made at least 14 days prior to the start of your registered camp week. No refunds will be issued within 14 days of your camp start date.
